We have used our understanding of full stops, capital letters, finger spaces and our phonics to write a 'wanted' poster to help us find Goldilocks.



We have started to explore animal classification and have learnt to sort animals into their different groups. We can also order and talk about the life cycles of our class birds.



We have begun to work in the style of Suzanne Barton. We have used different painting techniques to create textured paper just like her. We've used the paper to create our Christmas cards.

In Geography, we have looked at human and physical features of the landscape and identified these on a simple map.



We have continued to build on our individual phonics knowledge by learning new digraphs to read real and alien words.
